



LEAVING CERTIFICATE ESTABLISHED

It is a 2 year programme with a level 5 qualification upon completion.

Students sit 6 or more subjects and are marked out of their best 6

The leaving certificate is based on points. The most points you can receive is 625.


Gaeilge, English and Maths are compulsory subjects in Leaving Certificate. (unless officially exempt)





Excellent attendance – 90% attendance is needed to pass 02


Students are required to take part in classroom discussions and work on group projects as well as individual projects.

Examination	A 3-hour end-of-year exam will cover six major topics studied over two years. All topics covered in the course are guaranteed to appear in the exam.	
Career option	Chartered Accountant, Financial Analyst, Tax Consultant, and Management Accountant roles offer salaries ranging from €30,000–€50,000 at entry-level, €55,000–€85,000 mid-level, and €90,000–€150,000+ at senior-level.

In recent years NUI colleges have dropped their third language requirement for engineering and science programmes. UCD has also dropped it for their agricultural programmes. Nursing at NUI colleges never required a third language. A third language must be included for arts, human sciences, law, social science, commerce, medicine and health sciences and some other degrees. A third language is also a requirement for entry into the cadetship in the army or air corps. Trinity accepts Irish as a second language requirement. UL and DCU and the Institutes of Technology do not require a continental language for entry purposes to most of their courses, apart from those which involve the study of such a language.
